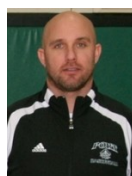

SWIMMING & DIVE by Melissa Hoogester



The Varsity Conference was held at Nicolet high school this year. It began on Thursday evening with the diving competition. J. Theis (342.95) had an awesome second place finish, C. Theis (325.95 – personal best score for him!) finished an awesome third place and Schmidt (283.05) had a great sixth place finish. It was an awesome way to begin the meet, with our divers doing so well! The 200 medley 'A' team: Miller, Olson, Biskobing, and DeMerit began the swimming competition with an awesome seventh place finish with their time 1:52.41. The 200 medley 'B' team: Tumey, Bischoff, Locke and Roller had a great tenth place finish with their best time, 2:02.20! DeMerit (2:01.16) had a nice eleventh place finish in the 200 freestyle earning some points for his team! Miller (2:18.83 – just hundredth off his best time) finished ninth and Olson (2:23.20 – just hundredth off his best time) finished eleventh in the 200 IM, both adding points to our team score! In the 50 freestyle, Biskobing (24.87 – a personal best time for him!) just missed scoring points for his team; he finished seventeenth. Olson (58.44 – a personal best time for him!) earned himself a spot on the awards podium with his awesome

sixth place finish in the 100 butterfly! Biskobing (1:02.06 – just hundredth off his best time) wasn't going to miss adding points to his tram's score in this event! He had a great fourteenth place finish in the 100 butterfly. DeMerit (5:22.91 – a personal best time for him by 8 seconds!) had an outstanding swim in the 500 freestyle! He earned himself a fourth place spot on the awards podium with that awesome swim! Our 'A' 200 freestyle relay team: Olson, Miller, Biskobing, and DeMerit earned themselves a sixth place on the awards podium with their awesome race and best time, 1:37.76! The 'B' 200 free relay team" Roller, Huebner, Huegerich and Howell had a great eleventh place finish with their time 1:45.82. Miller (59.68) just missed earning a medal for his awesome swim in the 100 backstroke. Roller (1:11.13) added a point to our total with his sixteenth place finish in the backstroke. Bischoff (1:13.96 -- a personal best time for him!) who finished thirteenth and Howell (1:17.21 – a personal best time for him!) who finished fifteenth in the 100 breaststroke both added points to our score! The 400 freestyle relay team: Huegerich, Huebner, DeMaria and Tumey had a great ninth place finish with their time, 4:01.27. It really was an awesome meet with many great times and awesome swims! Our Sectional guys will head to Ashwaubenon on Saturday to hopefully get some guys onto Madison for State!
