Our Sectionals meet was held at Ashwaubenon high school this year; which was a first for us. It was a great pool to swim in and the guys had an awesome meet! Our divers began the meet for us on Friday evening; J. Theis (339.55) came away with an awesome third place finish, C. Theis (323.90) was right behind his brother finishing fifth place and Schmidt (303.20) right behind them both finishing sixth place. All three guys qualified for the State diving competition!!!

The swimming portion began with the 200 medley relay team: Miller, Olson, Biskobing and DeMerit swimming an outstanding race, finishing sixth place with their best time, 1:49.29. Up next was DeMerit (1:55.00 - his personal best time by 6 seconds!) swimming the 200 freestyle. He had a great race, finishing ninth place! Bischoff (2:29.10 - his personal best time by 3 seconds!) was our only entry in the 200 IM and he came through for his team; he finished seventeenth place! Biskobing (24.50 - his personal best time!) chose to swim the 50 freestyle as one of his events and he too had a great race; he finished ninth place, just missing the awards podium. Olson (56.99 his personal best time by 2 seconds!), who has been prepping for this moment all season, swam an awesome race in the 100 butterfly. He finished an award podium sixth place and came SO close to moving onto State. He finished seventeenth overall and they take top sixteen. Biskobing (1:00.81 00 - his personal best time by 1 second!) and

Mehre (1:08.96 – his personal best time by 1 second!) also swam the 100 butterfly for their team. Both guys came ready to fight and they swam awesome races! Biskobing finished tenth place and Mehre finished seventeenth place. Miller (52.66) was up next to swim his first individual of the day, the 100 freestyle. He and DeMaria (1:00.90) both swam this event and had great races. Miller finished an award podium eighth place and DeMaria just missed scoring points for his team finishing nineteenth place. The 500 freestyle event was up next and this is what DeMerit has been training so hard for! He had an awesome race! He swam hard and finished an award podium fifth place dropping a 10 seconds on his best time, 5:12.30! Locke (6:02.16 – his personal best time by 7 seconds!) Also chose to swim the 500 freestyle; he also had a great race and dropped time, he finished twelfth place. Our 200 freestyle relay team: Olson, Miller, Biskobing and DeMerit have been working hard and today wasn't any different! They swam an awesome race earning a spot on the awards podium for their great sixth place finish and time, 1:38.24. Miller (57.86 - his personal best time by 1 second!), who has really come a long way this season working hard, was up next for the 100 backstroke, his event. He away an outstanding race, earning his spot on the awards podium with his sixth place finish! He also earned a spot on the State team for that awesome swim! Roller (1:12.16) also chose to swim the 100 backstroke, an event he continued to improve on all season! Olson (1:09.54 - his personal best time by 2 seconds!) and Bischoff (1:14.48) wanted to swim the 100 breaststroke for their last individual events of the meet. Both swam awesome races; Olson finished ninth place and Bischoff was right behind finishing twelfth place. The last event of the day, the 400 freestyle relay was swum by: Roller, Mehre, DeMaria and Bischoff. They had an awesome race, it was a fight until the end and a great way to finish the meet! They finished ninth place, just missing the awards podium. It was such an awesome meet! The guys have been training all season for this meet, and the determination and hard work they have put forth really came through today! We finished fifth as a team, have three divers and one swimmer heading to **Madison for the State Competition!**




**GRAFTON: 63**
