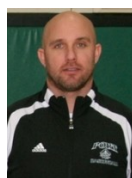

Port's first representation at the State Snowboard Championship was a solid performance. Taylor Stewart was one of only 9 freshman statewide to qualify. There were 73 athletes competing in the Slalom, Giant Slalom and Boarder Cross events on Saturday and Sunday. In the Giant Slalom race Taylor finished in 18th place with a time of 44.43. In Slalom he finished in 20th place with a time of 27.14 and in Boarder Cross he had a little slip and finished in 52nd place with a time of 36.88. Overall combined he finished in 27. His goal was to be in the top half and he is pretty proud!

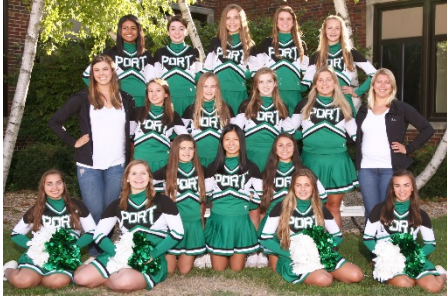
BEAVER DAM: 86

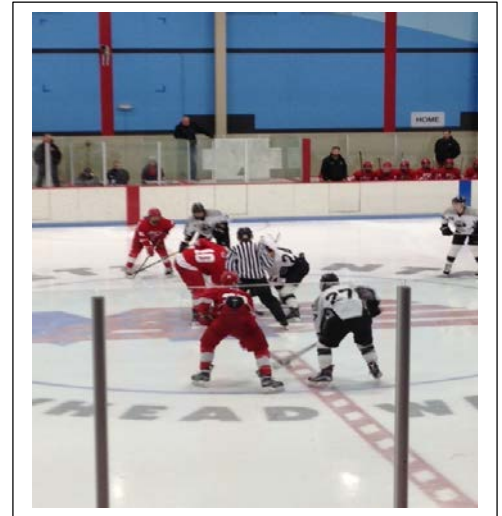
