ATHLETE OF THE WEEK



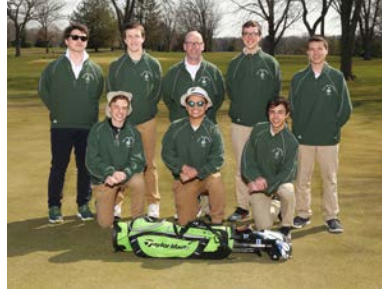
