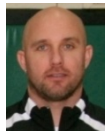

The Port boys traveled to Homestead last Friday night. The Pirates jumped out of the gates early and scored 16 in the first quarter while holding Homestead to 8 for the quarter. The second quarter had good back and forth action as Patrick McDonald was heating up. The Pirates held a five point advantage going into halftime. The third quarter featured Sam Weiland hitting some deep three pointers and solid man to man defense. Homestead made a big run at Port in the fourth quarter but the Pirates were poised down the stretch and held on in the fourth quarter to take home the two point win. The Pirates were led in scoring by Patrick McDonald with 17 points, Matt Kirmse with 11, Sam with 9, Tay Jackson with 6, and Darius and Brennan rounded out the scoring with 3 a piece.

The Pirates would then settle down and go on a 21-0 run fueled by four made 3 pointers and a steal and breakaway dunk. With the Pirates holding a 31-11 lead to start the third quarter the emphasis was still on playing solid defense and attacking the rim with drives. The fourth quarter was played even at 11-11 but every Pirate player on the roster was able to check in the game and make some sort of positive contribution. Saturday's invite at Menomonee Falls/Germantown was both a JV and Varsity Invite. Unfortunately, of our 13 girls on JV, only 3 were able to make the meet. (Most were doing the Young Americans thing.) Additionally, Varsity was missing lone senior Kristen Smith as well as junior Morgan Lopez. What was left for Varsity were three sophomores and three freshmen, many of whom are used to carrying much of the responsibility anyway.

Freshman Fallon Kennedy went down to the JV level to help where she picked up a medal for JV all-around and scored 23.05 of JV's 44.6 points. On two events, she was the only one to compete for our team. Unfortunately, without a supporting cast, there wasn't much she could do. JV was 5th of 5 behind Falls/Gtown (110.475), Watertown (109.8), Hartford (92.325), and Shorewood (77.65).

That left us with just five girls competing at the Varsity level. Four of them did all-around. Danielle O'Donnell finished 8th (31.2), Kaylyn Garant was 9th (30.7), Hailey Brakke was 12th (30.1), and Kylee Paradowski was 16th (24.4). Our high finisher on bars was O'Donnell in 7th with a 7.775 (of course they medal the top 6). O'Donnell also led our team on floor with an 8th place finish and a score of 8.275. Our beam leader was Brakke with a 7.55 in 9th. On vault, the top finisher was Garant in 11th with an 8.2. Season best's were posted by Brakke on floor (7.6) and bars (7.2). O'Donnell's 8.275 on floor was her best and also the highest mark anyone on our team has posted on floor this season, edging out

Garant and Smith who have also both scored over 8.0 on multiple occasions.

Knowing we were missing some key players, we had set a team goal for ourselves of 116.0. Our final team score was a 116.9. I thought our score should have been a little higher, especially on beam. There I felt like the scores were pretty consistently about .5 below what I expected. The girls score cards looked like I expected them to in terms of difficulty, event requirements, and bonus, so the judges must have been pickier than we've seen in the past about execution. At least, from what I can tell, they were consistent.

After sitting through all the awards and just missing out on many of them, it was very exciting when we found out we had taken 3rd place! It's not very often that we get to finish in the middle of the pack at an invite, and it felt like a win. The actual winner was Watertown with a 134.575. Falls/Gtown was second with a 131.2. Hartford was 4th with a 116.75 and Shorewood was 5th with a 112.075.

Our next meet is Wednesday, Jan. 29 in the Gymnastics room at 6:30pm.
