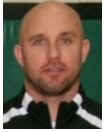

Vs. Milwaukee Lutheran

Riding a 3 game winning streak the Pirates hit the road to face Milwaukee Lutheran. A hot start shooting for both teams was capped by Brett Kirmse canning a 3 to give the Pirates a 16-13 after one. Ezra Bretl led the Pirates with 2 3s in the quarter. A bit of a cold shooting in the 2nd quarter saw the Pirates lose the lead heading into half as the Red Knights headed to the locker room up 3. The Red Knights hot shooting continued in the 3rd as they outscored the Pirates 18-10. Brennan Cassidy came off the bench with a lay in and a 3 from the corner to keep the Pirates within striking distance. The 4th quarter saw the Pirates come storming back. Big play after big play enabled the Pirates to force overtime. Sam Weiland led the charge in the 4th with 9 points including the game tying lay in. The overtimes included some intense, passionate basketball. Patrick McDonald was clutch from the line going 5-6 but the Red Knights with a key 3 off a missed free throw were able to squeak out the victory 71-65 in double overtime.

Holiday Tournament at Pewaukee

The Pirates boys traveled to Pewaukee High School to participate in the 1st Annual Tim Rueter Showcase. Saturday night had the Pirates facing the host school Pewaukee Pirates. Pewaukee jumped out early on the good Pirates scoring a quick ten points but after a timeout Port stormed back with the use of the three point shot. Port held an early first quarter lead at 15-13. Pewaukee used their size to gain advantage in the second quarter and went into halftime holding a 31-26 advantage. Port Washington had a good third quarter and was able to close the gap at the end of the quarter down one. Big three point baskets by Ezra Bretl and Brad Burbach and three baskets from Tay Jackson fueled the run. The fourth quarter was back and forth with Port Washington showing that they could make another run at Pewaukee. Brennan Cassidy's corner three closed the gap to one point with 1:30 remaining but Pewaukee was able to come right back down and hit a three of their own. Port got into a chasing game where we had to foul and Pewaukee was able to pull away and get the 62-55 victory. Port was paced by 20 points from Jackson, 14 from Sam Weiland, and 6 points apiece from Cassidy, Bretl, and McDonald.

In the second game of the Tim Rueter Showcase the Pirates saw action against the Suns of West Bend East. West Bend jumped out to an early 7-0 lead but the Pirates showed poise and once again used the three point shot to get right back in the game. Sam Weiland, Brennan Cassidy, and Matt Kirmse led the charge from three. With four of those in the first quarter the Pirates saw a first quarter lead of 16-12. The second quarter went back and forth a bit as both teams got some easy baskets but the Pirates were able to go into halftime with a 28-22 advantage. Port came out of halftime determined to hang on to the lead that was built but West Bend wasn't going to go away easy. GYMNASTICS

Vs. Whitefish Bay

Last year's showdown against Whitefish Bay ended 104.975 - 129.25. The meet this year was definitely a good news, bad news situation. This time around the score was 119.475-140.4.

In the good news column: the Port girls posted a 119.475--a score they beat only once all of last season, at sectionals. Also good news (in a way), the night was very average. There were a few really nice performances, and our beam was better than it has been, but in general, the night was just so so. The only top three finish of the night belonged to Dani O'Donnell in the all-around with a 30.95. Kaylyn Garant had a strong first competition on balance beam (7.975) and vault (8.2) coming off her ankle injury to lead the team on both events. Port was led by O'Donnell on bars (7.725) and Kristen Smith on floor (8.05). On floor, Kylee Paradowski posted her career best (7.4)! Hailey Brakke was the second highest scorer for Port on bars (7.175) and beam (7.35), while O'Donnell was second of our team on vault and floor.

In the bad news column: Whitefish Bay is REALLY good this year. Helped by two gymnasts who left the club program to compete at the high school level, Bay set the pace with a 140.4, which included high scores of 9.4 on vault, 9.375 on bars, 9.2 on beam, 9.275 on floor, and 36.775 all-around. Four of those five scores would have been good enough to win last year's state. Only bars would have received a second place.

This is problematic for Port because unlike most teams we compete against, Whitefish Bay is Division II. The top five individuals from each event advance from Sectionals to State and the top two teams. Bay had at least five better than Port's best tonight on beam and floor and four on vault and bars. With six other teams in the sectional, individual spots are going to be hard to come by. After seeing the meet tonight, it looks like Port's best chance to advance anyone to state may be as a whole team. The team has the talent to do it, but now it's time to put in the work.

Vs. Waupun

The Pirate gymnasts finished second on Saturday in the four team invite behind host Waupun. The meet was ran in an unusual fashion with 10 girls competing on each event instead of 5, the line-ups being put in a random order, and the team totals calculated by randomly selecting 5 scores from each event. In this manner, the team totals were Waupun 123.675, Port Washington 121.55, Jefferson 102.975, and Kaukauna 88.675. This unusual style of meet was definitely a first for us and one filled with lots of other firsts. It was the first time we have competed in an invited without any Division 1 schools. While we didn't win, Port took home 8 of the 15 medals.

Our lone gold went to Kaylyn Garant on balance beam with an 8.4. Her most impressive routine was nearly flawless as she made the beam look much wider than its 4 inches.

Second place medals went to Garant on vault (8.4), and Dani O'Donnell on uneven bars (8.0) and all-around (31.0).

Medals for third went to Kylee Paradowski on beam (7.8) and floor (7.95), O'Donnell on vault (8.3), and Garant all-around (30.8).

Those medal performances were new high scores for Garant on vault, beam, and all-around, and Paradowski on beam and floor. Also posting season bests were Carolyn Henkle on floor (6.7), Fallon Kennedy on bars (4.5), and Kristen Smith on beam (6.05).

Because we had twice as many entries as usual, a lot of girls stepped up in new places. Surprising performances came from Kennedy, competing floor for the first time and finishing in the top five of our team (6.85) and Brooke Lowry, competing vault at the Varsity level for the first time, also finished in our team's top five (6.75).

It was a great day all around for Paradowski, who in addition to picking up her first ever gymnastics medals, led the team on an event for the first time, and competed her first ever kip on bars. Henkle also had a notable first when she competed her round-off on the beam for the first time.
