Our dual against Grafton begin with the 200 Medley Relay A team of K. Brockman, S. Ottesen, B. Heinen and E. Andersen finishing second place with their time 2:20.89 followed by the B Relay team of B. Grady, M. McBride, M. Gotthart and A. Laabs finishing fourth place with their time 2:47.87. E. Andersen swam the 200 Freestyle finishing third place for her team with her time 2:27.72. A close third place finish by Andersen's team mate B. Heinen and her time 2:29.40. S. Ottesen swam the 200 IM finishing third place with her 2 second PR time 2:37.43. K. Brockman swam a great 50 Freestyle race finishing just behind a Grafton opponent for second place with her time 28.98. M. Gotthart and B. Grady also swam the 50 Freestyle finishing fifth and sixth with their times 33.52 and 33.60.

K. Smith and B. Murray did well for their team finishing third and fourth places in the diving event with their point totals 182.80 and 159.50. B. Brockman swam the 100 Backstroke for her team last evening and finished strong in second place with

her time 1:13.53; followed by her team mates B. Grady and A. Laabs finishing fourth and sixth place with their times 1:24.62 and 1:26.64- a 4 second drop and PR for A Laabs! S. Ottesen swam the 100 Breaststroke finishing third against some strong breaststroker opponents with her time 1:19.43. M.
