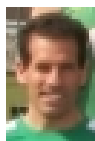

Our first home meet of the season was against Nicolet. The evening began with an exciting third place finish in the 200 Medley Relay by Klassen, Ottesen, Grady and Sharbuno with their time 2:25.22. The 200 Medley Relay B team of Artamonova, Orvis, McBride and Richlin finished fourth place with their time, 3:10.57. Klassen had a great meet last night; she swam the 200 Freestyle event finishing a close second with her time 2:27.75. McBride (2:59.17) and Grady (3:16.00) swam the 200 IM finishing fourth and fifth places. Sharbuno had some great wins for her team last night; the first was in the 50 Freestyle.
