Port volleyball traveled to the Shorewood Invite to take on several quality teams. Port was matched up in our first pool against Tosa West and University School. We finished 1-1 in Pool I good for second place defeating University School 2-1 (25-18, 19-25, 15-11) and losing to Tosa West 0-2 (17-25, 10-25). In our match against Tosa West, our serve receive was again the trouble spot not allowing our setters get the ball to our hitters. We bounced back against University School with a dominant performance in the 1st and 3rd set. Caitlin Schultz led the attack with 10 kills, Maggie Schmit with 8 digs and Sarah Maechtle with 12 assists for the match.

In our second pool we were matched up against host Shorewood HS and Rufus King HS. In our match against Rufus King, the girls came prepared and ready to compete winning 2-0 (25-9, 25-15). Sarah Colden had a good match scoring 4 kills, Hanna Strohm led with 10 assists, and Jenni Fidler had 5 digs. Our serve was dominant with 5 service aces for the match! We were then up against a strong Shorewood team losing 2 out of 3 sets (25-21, 13-25, 15-11). Our strong team serving continued into the 1st set totalling 4 service aces in which we were able to jump out to a big lead and finished strong. Our second set was tough as Shorewood rallied behind strong serving and put us behind early that we were not able to regain control. The 3rd set was back and forth all the way to 9-9 when Shorewood went ahead for good behind their strong net play which we were not able to match. Caitlin Schultz led in kills with 8 and also served 4 aces, Hanna Strohm had 10 assists, and Maggie Schmit received 16 serves and had 6

digs doing a great job helping our offense. By virtue of the win and loss, we finished 2nd in our pool which qualified our girls for the play-offs! We were matched up against eventual tournament winner and 18-1 Cedarburg. Our girls played at a very high level and went toe to toe with the best in our conference losing in two very tightly contested sets 20-15, 14-25. Caitlin Schultz led again in kills with 6 following closely behind was Jenni Fidler with 4, Jenni Fidler also led with 7 digs for the match and Hanna Strohm had 10 assists. Our finish in the 9 team tournament was a tie for 5th place!!



GIRLS SWIMMING and DIVE

Our first meet on the road was a great success! We saw some great swims and dives! Our divers K. Smith and B. Murray began the evening for us, and began it well! K. Smith finished first with 197.15 points and B. Murray finished second with 152.65 points. We had two 200 Medley Relay teams composed of K. Brockman, S. Ottesen, A. Nuedling, E. Andersen and B. Grady, M. McBride, B. Heinen, M. Gotthart. Brockman's relay finished second with their time 2:16.32 and Grady's relay finished fourth with their time 2:46.37. E. Andersen swam the 200 Freestyle finishing fourth with her time 2:35.28. B. Grady swam the 200 IM also finishing fourth with her time 3:23.94. A. Nuedling, B. Heinen, and M. McBride swam the 50 Freestyle. Nuedling finished second with her awesome time 28.96, Heinen finished fifth with her personal goal time of 32.38 and McBride swam it in 34.27. A. Nuedling also swam the 100 Butterfly alongside M. Gotthart. Gotthart finished fourth with her 1:28.20 time and Nuedling was right behind her finishing fifth with her 1:32.77 time. K. Brockman and E. Andersen swam the 100 Freestyle finishing second and third with their times 1:04.18 and 1:06.14. B. Heinen reached her second personal goal of the evening with her third place finish in the 500 Freestyle with her time 6:43.53. The 200 Freestyle Relay team of K. Brockman, E. Andersen, B. Heinen, and A. Nuedling finished a strong second place with their time 2:00.52. K. Brockman continued her successful evening with a first place finish in the 100 Backstroke with her time 1:13.22. B. Grady and M. Gotthart also swam the 100 Backstroke finishing fifth and sixth place with their times 1:27.93 and 1:29.79. S. Ottesen and M. McBride swam the 100 Breaststroke finishing second and fifth place with their times 1:22.83 and 1:53.96. The 400 Freestyle Relay team of B. Grady, M. McBride, M. Gotthart and S.
