VS: Plymouth

Ottesen continued the success with a third place finish in the 200 IM finishing 2:41.16. A. Nuedling improved her personal best 50 Freestyle time, 28.48 finishing fourth place. K. Smith and B. Murray helped add points to their team's score finishing second and third place in the diving event with their point totals of 192.40 and 166.00. K. Brockman had a great third place finish in the 100 Freestyle with her time 1:05.81. Our 200 Freestyle Relay composed of K. Brockman, A. Nuedling, S. Ottesen and E. Andersen finished an awesome second place with their time of 1:58.40; K. Brockman just out-touched the Plymouth team for that great finish! K. Brockman continued her great success of the evening with a third place finish in the 100 Backstroke with her time 1:12.25. S. Ottesen also continued her success with another third place finish in the 100 Breaststroke bettering her personal best time by over 1 second, 1:21.37! It was a great evening with some impressive swimming! The girls bettered their times and earned Varsity points!

Port Washington Pirate Swim & Dive Invitational:

The annual Pirate Invite was held on September 21<sup>st</sup> this year and a successful event at that! The invite consisted of 11 teams; Germantown, Kiel, Manitowoc Lincoln, Oak Creek, Plymouth, Port, Splash, Wauwatosa West, West Allis Hale/Central, West Bend East and West Bend West. K. Smith and B. Murray began the day with a solid third place and fifth finish in diving with their point totals of 303.50 and 278.45. B. Murray went into the semifinals ranked ninth, and came back with a great fifth place finish. S. Ottesen earned her team some points with her great twelfth place finish in the 200 IM and her time 2:40.12, dropping another second off her personal best time! A. Nuedling also finished a great twelfth place in her 50 Freestyle with her time 28.24. K. Brockman also earned some points for her team with her finish in the 100 Freestyle and a time of 1:03.10.
